






#### **Previous**



While increased connectivity is inevitable,



increased collaboration is not!



State Transportation Liaison Funded Positions Study (2009) notes that opportunities to physically locate the liaison funded positions at the State DOT office have led to "stronger working relationships" and allowed the liaison to learn more about the DOT's projects and "exchange information with it on a timelier basis."

23 CFR Appendix A to Part 450 details opportunities for linking transportation planning and NEPA processes, notes that "Some States have improved collaboration and efficiency by co-locating environmental, regulatory, and resource and transportation agency staff."



- ❖ December 2017: Concept is introduced to resource agencies
- Throughout 2018:
  - ✓ Interagency discussions on implementation plan
  - ✓ FHWA creates IOEQ Liaison position
  - ✓ GDOT acquires needed resources; creates State Environmental Liaison position
- ❖ January 2019, GDOT welcomes agencies to the IOEQ!



#### EARLY RESULTS

- > FHWA sees efficiencies resulting from relationships between agencies
- > All invited agencies are participating
- > Collaboration is allowing resource agencies to fulfill their mission
- > In-person interagency conversations are common, effective
- > Agency liaisons reporting positive experiences
- > Agency managers provided positive feedback at 6 month check-in
- > 17 projects & 12 programmatic efforts benefited in the first 3.5 months


